Dear dog lovers,

Let me introduce myself: I'm Vedi, a 19-month-old blond labrador. I'm what's known as a "dog in training"! I'm one of the older dogs? and I already travel around in a Scale Dogs van.

I arrived at my foster home just over a year ago. I was still very small, but I already had a big destiny! My host family, Susanne and Arnaud, had a lot to teach me. My instructor came to the house several times to check that I was toilet trained, that I was comfortable, and to see if my host family had any questions... Then we went out!

Every week, I was driven to the training location. Us little pups learned to be cool and quiet everywhere (even though I was always cool anyway (g)). We discovered lots of places around Scale Dogs: Stokkel, Auderghem, Tervuren, Hoeilaart, ... So I was able to feel confident wherever I was. Whether it's a market, a shop, a park, a station, etc. I, Vedi, feel very comfortable all over the place!

After that, we also learnt lots of ways of getting snacks, petting and praise: we can all sit, lie down, stand next to someone, walk at their pace, and so on. All you have to do is do it and you get a treat! And I love treats, they're so much better than being pet!

These sessions often took place with a group of puppies my own age. Sometimes we saw older dogs who were there to show us a good example. I really wanted to be like them! The only thing that was difficult was concentrating... You know, in the city there are so many distractions: smells, other dogs, objects lying around ... It's all so interesting! But I have to say that we dogs in training behave very well! Over the course of the lessons, we learnt to work better and better in town - perhaps you've already seen us there?

When I was old enough, healthy enough and wise enough, I started university! My teacher took me to my "boarding family" at Marie France's, where I stay in the evenings during the week. At the weekend, I go back to the host family where I grew up.

At the moment, I'm still learning a lot. Fortunately, I've already learnt a lot in puppy classes and with my foster family! My instructor comes to pick me up every morning and I jump in the van with great enthusiasm! Then we go and pick up my friend Vox

from his boarding family (he's a beginner, I'm still teaching him good manners) and off we go!

Before training, we go for a walk (first things first!) and then I can't wait to get into my working harness! My instructor tells me that I still have a lot to learn (OK, I've only been working with her for three months...), but I'm proving to be a good pupil! For example, I already know how to stop at pedestrian crossings and kerbs, I know how to avoid obstacles to our left or right, and I know how to indicate doors, staircases, seats and so on. What's more, I'm very proud of my ability to walk past other dogs and ignore them completely. With me, it's all about getting treats.

But I have to admit that I still need to learn to ignore food on the ground better.... My educator will certainly help me with this. Find out more about my progress in the next newsletter!

There are a number of ways you can help:

Donate to Scale Dogs:

You can make a donation to the IBAN account: BE37 0012 6238 0228 or by standing order. Any donation from 40€/year is tax deductible and the tax certificate will be sent to you at the beginning of the following year.

What can we do with your donation?

- 100 €: allows the purchase of collars, leashes, identification jacket, etc. for a puppy
- 250 €: allows the purchase of basic equipment for a puppy (bowls, basket, bench)
- 750 €: represents an average of the veterinary costs for a puppy during the 1st year
- 1.850 €: average price for the purchase of a puppy

By including Scale Dogs in your Will / DuoLeg

Wills in favour of a good cause benefit from the tax deduction scheme. By this means, it is possible to leave more for the people you care about while supporting Scale Dogs. Your notary can give you all the information on how to proceed.

Since July 2021, in Flanders, the tax regulations on joint bequests have been amended and therefore the duo bequest no longer offer any tax advantages in Flanders. With a duo bequest, you could bequeath part of your estate to a good cause and the other part to your family or friends. The beneficiary organization pays all inheritance tax, which often gives a tax advantage to the other heirs. While this tax advantage no longer applies in Flanders, in Wallonia and Brussels, the duo legacy continues to exist.

If you live in Flanders and have drawn up a will that includes a bequest in duo, please contact your notary to change your will.
