"We, the "V" generation, are in the middle of our training and things are getting serious. We have to be both focused and well-disciplined. Our instructors expect us to respond well to their orders, to help them cross streets by stopping at every crossing, to help them avoid obstacles by proposing new alternatives and to listen carefully to all the commands they give us. After an intense morning in Stockel, we were all able to play together in the park behind the offices of our instructors, who were in a meeting (wonder what they're saying about us?). It was a very busy day, but as they say, after work comes play! We'll all soon be (we hope), the companions of a beneficiary and we'll be so proud to help them on a daily basis."

Our dogs in placement

Udji is currently in training with her beneficiary. In the next few weeks, they should pass their final assessment.

Ubi is placed with Ingrid. After a month's training, during which the instructor taught Ingrid how to live and work with Ubi, they are now continuing to train independently until they sit their final exams in 3 months' time. Ingrid is an active woman with a varied daily commute. Ubi accompanies her to the sandwich shop, the chemist's and all the shops in her neighborhood, as well as accompanying her on family visits and on all outings and activities in the bustling city of Antwerp, all by tram, train and bus. Ubi makes her outings much smoother and less tiring by guiding her around obstacles on the pavement, looking for a free space on public transport, finding the door, the stairs, the counter, the dustbin and much more. In addition to this, there are also daily walks in the forest and park where Ubi can run, sniff and play with other dogs. This also allows Ubi to simply be a dog. They form a beautiful duo, growing closer and more harmonious every day.

Our placed dogs

Uggie was placed with Wouter this month after passing his final assessment with success. It is Wouter's second guide dog from Scale Dogs. Uggie and Wouter very quickly formed a close bonded team. Wouter's previous guide dog, Mace, is now enjoying retirement with Jos, his host family.

I'm in training at Scale Dogs and I'm soon to become a guide dog, you've probably seen me on TV!

Since we last spoke, I've become a star, in fact I was filmed by RTBF. I really did my best that day! I showed them how serious, focused, motivated and handsome I am ... oh but I actually already do all that every day (a)

The RTBF news item 'Puppies and future guide dogs looking for foster families' put me front and centre along with my colleagues Scott and Wilson who were with me. Everyone saw it! I got lots of compliments, it was great and I enjoyed it! But the subject was very serious... If no one becomes a host family, there won't be any more dogs like me to help people in need :

I also wanted to let you know that my training is coming to an end! And yes, my studies are almost over and I'll be graduating soon, I'm so proud of myself! My instructor, to whom I owe my guide dog training, tells me that I'm very well-behaved and very reliable. When I'm just out for a walk, I make the most of it and sniff calmly. But when I see my harness I'm so happy, I love my job! I quickly straighten my head and wait a little impatiently until my instructor is ready to start. She gives me the command and off we go! I show her that I can handle things such as pedestrian crossings (I love them!), doors, benches and stairs. I also work without controls! If I see that there's an obstacle or danger in front of us, I show my teacher that our route is blocked. On her signal (we guide dogs can't take cars into account...), I resolve the situation by going around the danger before continuing on our way. Without a command I also ignore distractions: dogs, people, food on the ground - this last point is so difficult because I do love my food!

I'm very grateful to my foster family for showing me everything when I was a puppy, so now as an (almost) guide dog I'm really not afraid to take public transport and to work in any environment in the city \bigcirc

Now I just need to meet the person who will become my new master! I can't wait to spend my life with her, to go everywhere together, and share lots of adventures ②. But of course, I'll have my dog life too: walks, games and relaxation are also necessary for all of us!

Donate to Scale Dogs:

You can make a donation to the IBAN account: BE37 0012 6238 0228 or by standing order. Any donation from 40€/year is tax deductible and the tax certificate will be sent to you at the beginning of the following year.

What can we do with your donation?

- 100 €: allows the purchase of collars, leashes, identification jacket, etc. for a puppy
- 250 €: allows the purchase of basic equipment for a puppy (bowls, basket, bench)
- 750 €: covers the average veterinary costs for a puppy during the 1st year
- 1.850 €: is the average price for the purchase of a puppy
- +/- 43,500 €: is the grand total of all the costs for a guide dog or an autism dog

Very soon you will be able to make a donation via QR Code which will be available on our website.

By including Scale Dogs in your Will / DuoLeg

Wills in favour of a good cause benefit from the tax deduction scheme. By this means, it is possible to leave more for the people you care about while supporting Scale Dogs. Your notary can give you all the information on how to proceed.

Since July 2021, the tax regulations in Flanders on joint bequests have been amended and since then the duo bequest no longer offers any tax advantages in Flanders. With a duo bequest, you could bequeath part of your estate to a good cause and the other part to your family or friends. The beneficiary organization pays all inheritance tax, which often gives a tax advantage to the other heirs. While this tax advantage no longer applies in Flanders, the duo legacy continues in Wallonia and Brussels, . If you live in Flanders and have drawn up a will that includes a bequest in duo, please contact your notary to change your will.
