## THE THANK YOU DAY

Scale Dogs took part in the MERCI event held from 28 to 31 May at the Botanical Gardens in Meise. It was a fantastic opportunity to extend a warm welcome to our volunteers, donors and interested testators. Thank you to everyone for their support. Scale Dogs was not alone at this event, in fact no less than 82 associations were also present, more than 2,500 guests and 8 assistance dogs, including 3 from Scale Dogs.

## 2023 JUST A FEW FIGURES!

In 2023 Scale Dogs welcomed 23 dogs, 4 dogs were placed as guide dogs with beneficiaries, but there were also 3 dogs placed as Buddy Dogs or autism dogs with children, 3 dogs who will complete their training and be placed in 2024, 4 dogs who will begin their training in 2024, 3 dogs declared fit to become guide dogs and will also be placed in 2024. 6 dogs were permanently retired. Congratulations to Sofie and her team Annick, Jessica, Marie and Shona for this magnificent work!



## INTERNATIONAL TRAINING

In June, the Scale Dogs team of instructors took part in a training course for assistance dogs organised by ADI (Assistance Dogs International) and two other Belgian associations. It was an opportunity to meet 74 participants from 4 different continents, including 14 instructors.

The idea was to provide training through workshops and to share methods that can be quite different from one association to another and, particularly, from one country to another.

English was the order of the day, with around a hundred participants from Canada, Japan, China, Taiwan and the United States. All the participants described the event as exceptional.

On Sunday 23th June, the volunteers organised a walk in the Meerdaalwoud in aid of Scale Dogs. Fortunately, after weeks of waiting for good weather, the Sunday was beautifully sunny and warm! We had over fifty participants, with or without their pooches! Thank you to everyone who took part and to our volunteers, without whom this walk would never have taken place!



## SCALE DOGS AT SCHOOL

Our volunteers, who never shy away from a task, went to the Lycée Mater Dei in Woluwe-Saint-Pierre on 5th June to run a workshop for pupils in their 5th and 6th year humanities who had written their end-of-year project on blindness. This was an opportunity to teach them how to walk with a white cane and then to take them for a walk with Tailou, our demonstration guide dog. On 11 June, the same volunteers visited the 2nd and 5th Primary classes at the Centre school in Uccle. The visit followed on from work by the 5th Primary pupils on Hélène Keller, a famous American lecturer and writer who left her mark on the first half of the 20th century through her political and feminist struggles, despite having been deaf, blind and mute since early childhood. The students had also organised a piggybank collection in aid of Scale Dogs. Many thanks to everyone!

## Soutenez Marianne et ses chiens investis d'une mission !

Marianne Vander Eecken travaille à la Banque depuis septembre 2023. Après une mutation interne, elle est aujourd'hui Account Officer au contact direct et travaille entres autres pour la Centrale des Biens. Notre collègue a un faible pour les animaux, en particulier les chiens. C'est la raison pour laquelle elle s'est engagée auprès de Scale Dogs, une ASBL unique qui forme des chiens guides pour les personnes malvoyantes. Tous les chiens guides reçoivent la même éducation que le chien. Mais, contrairement à ce que beaucoup de gens pensent, le chien ne suit pas tout. C'est son rôle de former un labrador. De plus, les chiens sont très largement sélectionnés à la demande. »

Pour soutenir des organisations comme Scale Dogs, nous offrons plus de conseils aux personnes malvoyantes. Le chien guide pour un double rôle : il est à la fois un guide fiable et un ami pour le vie.

What can we do with your donation?

- 100 €: enables the purchase of collars, leads, identification jackets, etc. for a puppy
- 250: to buy basic equipment for a puppy (bowls, basket, bench)
- 750: represents average veterinary costs for a puppy during its 1st year of life
- 1,850: average price for the purchase of a puppy
- +/- €43,500: average cost of training a guide dog or autism dog

## By including Scale Dogs in your Will / Duo Legacy

Wills in favour of a good cause benefit from the tax deduction scheme. This makes it possible to leave more to your loved ones while supporting Scale Dogs. Your solicitor can give you all the information you need on how to proceed. With a duo bequest, you can leave part of your estate to a good cause and the other part to your family or friends. The beneficiary organisation pays all inheritance tax, which often gives the other heirs a tax advantage. However, this tax advantage no longer applies in Flanders. In Wallonia and Brussels, the duo bequest continues to exist.

Since July 2021, in Flanders, the tax regulations relating to duo bequests have been amended and, as a result, duo bequests no longer offer any tax advantage. If you have drawn up a will including a duo bequest, please contact your notary to amend your will!

You can find below an example of a Duo-Legs for Mme Monique who has no children and want to make a legs to her two nephews.

### A legacy without the Duo-Legs :

Each nephew receives a gross legacy of 250,000€.

Inheritance tax on each nephew's legacy:

0 to 50,000€: 35% to 17,500€

50,000€ to 100,000€: 50% to 25,000€

100,000€ to 175,000€: 60% to 45,000€

175,000€ to 250,000€: 70% to 52,500€

Total inheritance tax on the legacy to each nephew :

17.500€ + 25.000€ + 45.000€ + 52.500€ = **140.000€.**

Total inheritance tax: €140,000 x 2 = **280,000€.**

Net legacy to each nephew: 250,000€ - 140,000€ =

**110,000€.**

No good cause involved.

### With a 50-50 joint legacy:

Scale Dogs receives a gross legacy of 250,000€.

Each nephew receives a net legacy of 125,000€.

Inheritance tax on Scale Dogs' legacy:

250,000€ x 7% = 17,500€.

Inheritance tax on each nephew's legacy:

30€ to 50,000€: 35% to 17,500€

50,000€ to 100,000€: 50% to 25,000€

100,000€ to 125,000€: 60% to 15,000€

Total inheritance tax on the legacy to each nephew: 17,500€ + 25,000€ + 15,000€ =

57,500€.

Total inheritance tax: 17,500€ + (57,500€ x 2)

= **132,500€ paid by Scale Dogs**

Net legacy to each nephew: **125,000€ VS**

**110,000€ (san Duo-Legs)**

Net legacy to Scale Dogs: 250,000€ - 132,500€

= **117,500€.**
